Observance of 10th Anniversary of the Launch of Mars Orbiter Mission

(05 November, 2023)

Palampur Science Centre has celebrated the 10th anniversary of the launch of Mars Orbiter Mission by organising a Sky Observation Programme at 5:45 PM on 5th November, 2023 in the centre premises. In this programme, Moon, Saturn and Jupiter were shown in sky by the telescope. Shri Ram Swaroop, Project Coordinator, Palampur Science Centre interacted with the esteemed visitors and explained the type of path covered by Mangalyaan after its launch from Sriharikota and its objectives. Along with this, the discussion on the craters on moon, rings of Saturn and the satellites of Jupiter were also done. Around 40 visitors attended this Sky observation programme.
